A Roadmap to Online Learning

Professional and career colleges and universities can drive enrollment and revenue with a well-planned online learning strategy.



START:

TAKE ONE MILE AT A TIME TO ARRIVE AT A SUCCESSFUL ONLINE PROGRAM



Understand your reasons for going online. Does it make sense for your institution and its current and potential students?

Do the math. What will an online program cost in staff hours, tech upgrades and support and training? Will online revenue outpace these costs?

GET COMMITMENT FROM ADMINISTRATORS



Task force members should include administrators and faculty who get input from students.

CONVENE A TASK FORCE



A single point person should "own" the start-up initiative and be able to answer administrator's questions.

DESIGNATE A LEADER





Use financial proof points and surveys to show viability and student interest.

The task force will design a program framework, research accreditation, shop for technology vendors, do market research and, finally, create a successful vision for the program.



Don't let mission creep detour task force members.

They should focus on creating the program, not get bogged down in content and staffing needs for specific courses.

CREATE POLICIES AND PRACTICES GEARED TOWARD ACCREDITATION

The accreditation process for an online program can take from a few weeks to a couple of years and could involve national, regional and state agencies.

Use well-established best practices in distance-learning pedagogy to help speed up the accreditation process.

UNDERSTAND YOUR TECHNICAL NEEDS



What is your IT budget?
Can it grow?



Institutional leaders must fuel an online program with their time and the institution's money.

How robust is your technology infrastructure?



Faculty resistance is a fact of online life. Make a plan to address it, and get input from some naysayers.

Roughly 80 percent of institutions with online online programs offer training for online instruction.



PREPARE THE FACULTY



Understand what competing institutions are doing and how your school will differentiate itself in the online marketplace.
